- Monitor and facilitate understanding of the Investment Department's policies, guidelines and regulations on continuous basis, subject but not limited to: Staff Guidelines, Statement of Investment Objectives and Policy (SIOP), Ohio Retirement Study Council (ORSC) requirements, Securities Exchange Commission (SEC) Filings and Ohio Revised Code (O.R.C) legislation.
- Maintain Investment Department policies and implement review procedures.
- Coordinate with STRS Ohio legal and compliance teams ensuring investment activities, processes and guidelines adhere to applicable laws, policies and regulations.
- Complete and disseminate required regulatory disclosures, registrations, affirmations and representations.
