

OBJECTIVE

The objective of the **CFMA Member Scholarship** is to enable students with a relationship to a CFMA member company to pursue their finance, accounting or construction management educational objectives.

REQUIREMENTS

The scholarship has multiple requirements. All competitive applicants are expected to meet all of the below stated requirements:

1. Enroll in an eligible Oregon/SW Washington Colleges or Universities as a student.
2. Declare an accounting, finance, or construction management major, enroll in a Bachelors program or an advanced degree program in business or construction management.
3. Demonstrate a GPA of 3.0 or higher.
4. Submit a complete CFMA Scholarship Application.
5. Submit a 300-word essay demonstrating how the applicant's courses benefit the member organization to which the applicant is related.
6. Submit a current transcript from the Colleges or Universities attended thus far.
7. Submit your current resume.
8. Submit 2 letters of recommendations, with one academic and one from the business community (letters cannot be from a member of the applicant's immediate family).
9. Mail the transcript and letters of recommendations to the attention of Todd D McDaniel, CPA, CCFIP, Scholarship Committee Chair, c/o Streimer Sheet Metal Works, Inc., 740 North Knott Street, Portland, OR 97227. If submitting your application by email, then application, resume, and essay should be sent to Portland.CFMA@gmail.com with the subject line indicating "Scholarship Application" followed by your last name. If submitting the application by mail, please use the address indicated above.

APPLICATION DEADLINE

All application materials, including the required application, transcript and essay must be received by the CFMA on or before April 16, 2018.

REVIEW AND AWARD

Scholarships ranging from **\$1,000 to \$3,000** will be awarded in May, 2018 for the academic year beginning Fall, 2018. Scholarship winners will be notified via phone and honored at the CFMA Annual Golf Tournament dinner in September, 2018. Attendance is required.

The CFMA Portland Chapter includes representatives from Construction Firms, Public Accounting Firms, Insurance Firms and various construction related partners in the Portland Metro Area. The Chapter's Scholarship Committee will award all scholarships based upon the above stated criteria.
