

***CoreNet Global Benelux Chapter members to review
six key real estate issues drawn from the End User Debate***

Brussels (X November 2011) – CoreNet Global’s Benelux Chapter in collaboration with AT Osborne is set to debate six key real estate topics drawn from the findings of 40 key propositions in a “House of Commons” style End User debate in Zaandam on 29th November.

Expected to attract more than 100 participants, the event will present the findings from the last three annual End User debates held during Provada, with members invited to debate the most important conclusions arising from the previous debates.

Topics will include:

- Sustainability: is there enough interest among end users?
- Social property and the role of real estate
- New balance agreements – where will tenants fit?
- Integrated contracts – when will the time be right?
- What kinds of buildings are suitable for the new world of work?
- Is Corporate Real Estate Management (CREM) still in its infancy?

The aim of the event is to focus on the opportunities and challenges that will be faced by the users and providers of real estate up to 2013. Participants will include real estate leaders from a range of backgrounds, including business, government, education and healthcare.

The House of Commons debate will be led by Flip Verwaaijen (Post NL Real Estate), Monique Arkesteijn (TU-Delft) and Kees Rezelman (AT Osborne). In addition to the conference, the programme will include a tour of the new centre of Zaandam (Project Inverdan) and a visit to the new City Hall in Zaanstad.

The event will conclude with a farewell to current Chair Flip Verwaaijen and the announcement of a new Benelux Chapter leader plus two new board members.

The event will take place on Tuesday, 29th November from 14.00 at the Intel hotel in Zaandam.
