EDUCATION, COLLABORATION... and a Really Great Time!

Over 200 attendees enjoyed a world-class educational and networking event at the Town of Ayrsley, located in Charlotte, NC.

The event, entitled Where the Sidewalk Begins: A Sustainable Approach to Neighborhood Development, provided an opportunity for participants to learn about smart growth, new urbanism and the realities about the sustainability revolution. The Town of Ayrsley is a 180-acre, 5 million-square-foot master-planned urban development in southwest Mecklenburg County. The community features a vibrant combination of mixed-use retail, business and a neighborhood district, offering residents and visitors all the services, advantages and excitement of living

within a walkable, "new urban" area.

Hunter Fleshood, Vice-President of the CoreNet Global Carolinas Chapter Board of Directors, and a member of the USGBC-Charlotte Region Chapter Board of Directors, was the Chair of the event. Hunter also served as the Master of Ceremonies for the outstanding reception event that evening. His serious passion for sustainability, combined with his wonderful sense of humor, allowed Hunter to successfully engage participants throughout the day's events.

The program featured two renowned keynote speakers—**Sophie Lambert,** Director of LEED for Neighborhood Development for the US Green Building Council (USGBC), and **Auden Schendler,** Executive Director of Sustainability for the Aspen Skiing Company, both of whom captivated the audience with their insight and authority.

Ms. Lambert's overview of the LEED Neighborhood Development (LEED-ND) rating system was a true eye-opener about the ways smart urban development provides social and economic benefits for residents, communities and developers. The rating system has been implemented in 238 pilot projects, and its national launch in early fall 2009 will change the way communities are developed, managed and inhabited.

Mr. Schendler's presentations helped participants understand that protecting our environment is a critical mission for which each and every one of us is responsible. He asserted that climate change

is a reality and that each individual has a role in saving the planet. By using wit and humor, Mr. Schendler was able to make this difficult and controversial subject matter interesting for all listeners. Those in attendance


received a copy of Mr. Schendler's book, *Getting Green Done*, compliments of Allsteel.

Event participants were also provided with a fascinating overview and grand tour of the Town of Ayrsley, given by **Gene Bodycott**, the Executive Vice President of New Forum. Mr. Bodycott is an accomplished architect and urban planner, and previously served as a Managing Partner at Odell Associates.

After a day of information and education, the event wrapped up with an evening reception at the beautiful Hilton Garden Inn Hotel. Local Ayrsley eateries provided delicious refreshments, ranging from sumptuous Indian Curry Chicken to traditional southern Hot Wings. The wings were hot, but the
