Corporate Real Estate 2020

Corporate Real Estate 2020 is CoreNet Global's transformational research initiative envisioning the future of business and the changing nature of work. I have been writing feature articles for *CoreIssues* for the past four years. Oftentimes the articles are topical in nature and prove to be easy to write. However, sometimes the featured subject matter poses much more difficulty for me...this issue was one of those instances! Our Communications team knew that this issue's main article had to present the value of our recent Carolinas Chapter survey. How was I going to make the survey results interesting or compelling to our readers?

During a recent weekend visit to Beaufort, NC, I was walking the boardwalk along the waterfront, and it came to me! What, you might wonder, does a sleepy little southern waterfront town have to do with article you are reading? Well, it served to be the inspiration for an analogy that resonated with me — and one I knew I had to share.

While I was standing on the boardwalk, I had the opportunity to watch a sailboat captain navigate his way into the harbor. As I surveyed him skillfully work the main sail, capturing the ocean breeze to propel the boat through the harbor, I recognized a clear parallel to our stellar Chapter and the recent survey. The "ah-ha" moment hit me, and I'm excited to present it to you here.

The responses (or data) received from our members through the survey represent the wind that is captured by a sail. Our job as Chapter leaders is similar to that of the captain's: We need harness the wind and use it to skillfully guide and adjust the direction we take the Chapter.



Members are the lifeblood of any association, not only for the revenue provided through their annual dues, but also with their time and talents as volunteers. THE RIGHT COURSE

The survey results that were provided will help chart the course or direction we take the Chapter. The great news is that, overall, 88% of recent survey participants are satisfied or very satisfied with their Chapter membership. Survey respondents also noted that the Chapter is delivering exceptional programs. For example, members believe our programs are of high caliber, relevant and representing current trends. Moreover, most respondents also feel that the Chapter activities and benefits are of value and that they would recommend the Carolinas Chapter of CoreNet to their peers.

NECESSARY SHIFTS

The Carolinas Chapter held dual Sweat Equity events on November 9th at **Second Harvest** Food Bank in Charlotte and the Food Bank for Central & Eastern North Carolina in Raleigh. CoreNet volunteers sorted food donations that will be distributed to charitable agencies in the Charlotte and Raleigh areas.



Both food banks partner with agencies in 53 North Carolina counties through Feeding America. The agency recipients include soup kitchens, emergency pantries, emergency shelters, low-income daycares, senior programs and group homes. Feeding America is the nation's leading domestic hunger-relief charity. Their mission is to feed America's hungry through a nationwide network of member food banks and engage our country in the fight to end hunger.

On September 28th an energetic group of 18 volunteers from our Carolinas Chapter participated in a unique outreach opportunity. This Sweat Equity event was held at the **Inter-Faith Food Shuttle Farm** in Raleigh and also focused on our Community Reinvestment pillar of Hunger. The group worked hard on a wide variety of activities at the farm, including building a framework for a greenhouse to be used to cultivate seedlings for summer planting.
