Barry Jantz was appointed Chief Executive Officer in 2004, after serving as a community relations consultant, managing the District's annual grants program. His prior experience includes financial services manager of the Facilities Development Department at Kaiser Permanente and as district chief of staff to California Assemblyman Jay La Suer. Jantz was a member of the La Mesa City

Council from 1990 to 2006, and currently serves on the boards of the East County Economic Development Council, East County Chamber of Commerce and San Diego County Taxpayers Educational Foundation. His educational background includes journalism and political science at Grossmont College and San Diego State University. In his years as CEO of the District, Jantz led the effort to complete over \$260 million in Proposition G improvements at Grossmont Hospital, as well as a successful 2014 ballot measure to continue the lease of the hospital to Sharp HealthCare until 2051.

#### **CSDA ELECTION RESULTS**

California Special Districts Association has counted the votes for Seat C in the Southern Region (San Diego, Imperial, Orange, Los Angeles, San Bernardino and Riverside). Arlene Schafer was

reelected to the Board and will serve a 3-year term (2023). Director Schafer has served 20 years as a Board Member on the Costa Mesa Sanitary District in Orange County. The CSDA Board of Directors has 18 members consisting of three directors from each of the six networks in California. The Board Members serve a rotating 3-year term within their Network. Listed below are the Board Members representing the Southern Network: **San Diego County:** Jo MacKenzie, Dir, VID, Term 2021-Seat A, **San Bernardino County:** Don Bartz, GM, Phelan Pinon Hill Community Services District, Term 2022-Seat B, and **Orange County: Arlene Schafer,** Dir, Costa Mesa Sanitary District, Term 2023. Seat C.

**CSDA UPDATES** - The Virtual Awards Presentation scheduled for August 26 has been cancelled. Field Coordinator, Chris Palmer, will be making virtual and live presentations to the winners as they are able. Winners will be featured in the magazine, e-news and CSDA social media. If you are a winner, Chris will be coordinating directly with you.

The CSDA Virtual District Network meetings will still be happening on August 26. The field coordinators have, as of this writing, not confirmed hours or session description---Stay Tuned! **LEGISLATURE** - The Legislature is back from their extended recess which was due to several people, legislators and staff, coming down with the Covid-19.

August 31 is still the last day for each house to pass bills. On July 20, there was a memo stating that lawmakers will be able to vote remotely but won't get a per diem. This idea was to be voted on July 27.

Toni Atkins, President Pro Tem, stated: "As California continues making its way through this pandemic, the Legislature has to keep exploring ways to conduct the people's business safely and in keeping with our Constitution."

The next five weeks will be a race to the finish! CSDA and ACWA and other associations will be sending Legislative Alerts asking for your responses. Please take the time to read and respond.

**Duties of the President** are (1) to preside over all meetings, (2) oversee the Scholarship/ Grant Committee activities, (3) sign checks in the absence of the Treasurer, and (4) assume the board position of Immediate Past President after term(s) served.

**Duties of the 1st Vice President** are (1) to be responsible for speakers and programs for the regular meetings, (2) act in the place of the President as necessary.

**Duties of the Treasurer** are (1) be responsible for collecting and depositing all funds, (2) dispense funds as specified by the Board of Directors, (3) keep current records of members' names and addresses for invoice purposes, and (4) provide quarterly reports and one annual audit report.

"Officers shall be elected at the annual meeting to be held in the fourth quarter of each year. The slate of officers will be presented by the Nomination Committee. Nominees from the floor are permissible. In the event there is more than one nominee for an office, a secret ballot will be conducted." Bylaws, rev. 10-19-2019

Term of Office: Two years, beginning January 1 of the following year.

#### **David Kulchin**







**Past President** 

David Kulchin, a longtime community volunteer, Leucadia Wastewater District board member, and 2013 Carlsbad Citizen of the Year, died suddenly and peacefully at his home July 12, 2020. He was 91. David and his wife, Ann, were married for 66 years.

In addition to being an elected member of the Leucadia water board since 1996, David Kulchin served on nonprofits including the Magdalena Ecke Family YMCA in Encinitas, the Boys and Girls Clubs of Carlsbad, Hospice of the North Coast, the Scripps Memorial Hospital Encinitas Community Advisory Board, and the Carlsbad Hi-Noon Rotary Club. Kulchin led a campaign that raised hundreds of thousands of dollars to build the Boys and Girls clubhouse that opened in 2011 in the new residential community of Bressi Ranch. As chair of the Scripps hospital advisory board, he helped raise money to build a critical-care wing there in Encinitas.

"The key to community progress is volunteerism," Kulchin said when he was named Citizen of the Year. "If it wasn't for the talent and time and money that people put into community-based and city-based organizations, we wouldn't have the quality of life we have today. "When a community is able to pull together a variety of people to help achieve goals, everybody is richer," he said.
