The following article is the second of several revisiting a series originally published between 2005-2008, called "Number Pick'n". They take some obscure or interesting item and present a sometimes semi-serious, sometimes just plain fun pondering of where to specify it. Enjoy!

MF NUMBER PICK'N – FIRE POLES

The topic of Fire Poles and just where to address them in MasterFormat came up recently in an online forum. So, as a Number Pick'n topic, you could say I kind of slid into this one.

One of the most recognized icons of fire stations is the brass fire pole. They were first used in 1878, invented by Captain David Kenyon of the Chicago Fire Department. Insurance companies have discouraged them in recent years due to injuries. Also many fire stations built today are single story structures that do not utilize fire poles. Others firehouses use a type of slide.

A more generic term for fire poles is "slide pole". The term "fire pole" is also sometimes used in reference to the long pikes used by firemen. And we are seeing "fire poles" included as components of play structures on many playgrounds. To add to the terminology confusion, one manufacturer of portable radiant heaters uses the term to describe one of their products.

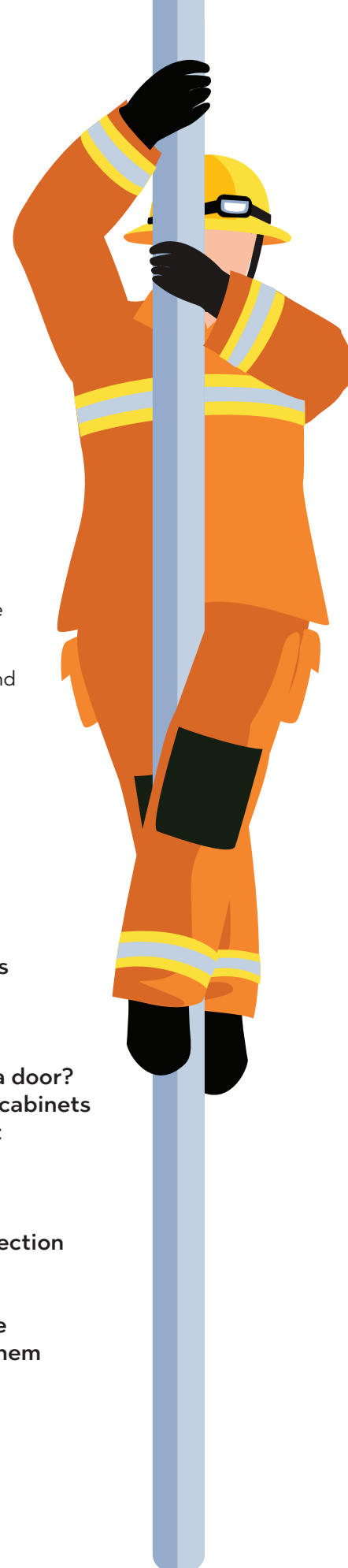
Some early versions were made of wood (imagine the sliver issue). Brass is the most familiar and most often material used. There may also be fiberglass versions. Either way, there is a "art" to sliding down a fire pole and avoiding injury, either from the landing, or from good 'ol friction.

So are fire poles products, or work results. I think we could build a case for work result, especially considering how fire poles have evolved. Fire pole can be simply a brass pole with fittings top and bottom mounted through a hole in the second story floor. However, today's manufactured fire poles come as a system with trim for the hole, safety railings around the hole, closures for the hole, and landing pads.

Now to the question . . . where, in MasterFormat, can we address them. Let's check . . .

- 05 50 00 – Metal Fabrications . . . metal railings are here, think "extreme" banisters
- 05 59 00 – Metal Specialties . . . explanation description fits for fabricated version
- 06 40 00 – Architectural Woodwork . . . slivers aside, I did say some were wood
- 06 60 00 – Plastic Fabrications . . . fiberglass anyone?
- 08 11 73 – Sliding Metal Fire Doors . . . the title starts out OK, but is the floor hole a door?
- 10 44 00 – Fire Protection Specialties . . . sounds good, but this is for extinguisher cabinets
- 10 75 00 – Flagpoles . . . they do look like one . . . but better remove that rope cleat
- 10 80 00 – Other Specialties . . . could be a "catch-all" home
- 11 60 00 – Entertainment Equipment . . . not gonna go there, Gypsy Rose
- 11 66 13 – Exercise Equipment . . . have seen 'em in some gyms
- 11 67 00 – Recreational Equipment . . . climbing walls are here, but that's wrong direction
- 11 68 16 – Play Structures . . . sure, some play structures do have sliding poles
- 14 90 00 – Other Conveying Equipment . . . escape slides are included here
- 21 12 00 – Fire Suppression Standpipe . . . that's another kind of tube related to fire
- 28 31 53 – Fire Alarm Initiating Device . . . no, the alarm initiates action on one of them

MasterFormat is actually mute on this topic, so there is some flexibility on where one might slide them in. Fabricated poles might be appropriate somewhere in 05 50 00 or 05 59 00. But considering some of the manufactured versions as systems make a location in 10 80 00 or 14 90 00 an acceptable choice as well.

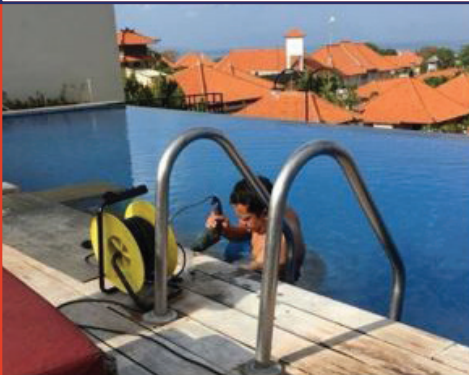
