# **PRESIDENT'S ADDRESS**

I enjoy walking booth to booth, talking with reps, handling product samples and bringing that knowledge back to the office and sharing it with coworkers. I think my love for product shows goes back to high school and my architectural drafting classes, when I would attend the local home expo and see all sorts of products I could incorporate into my school projects.



I have missed walking the floor and meeting with product reps during the epidemic. It was a bit disappointing that the National CSI Conference did not include the product show. Although the BPM (Building Product Manufacturer) Speed Networking did give attendees some one-on-one time with reps. If the Institute moves on hosting the National Conference without a trade show organization, I would hope they could look at having the Host Chapter coordinate their trade show with the event.

Trade shows are the essence of what CSI is all about. It is the gathering of the facility owner, design, construction and manufacturing professions. Within our region we have a number of chapters that put on a variety great trade shows. There are a number of best practices of our chapters that can be considered and incorporated into your own chapter's program. Talk to any of them for suggestions or recommendations. At our Regional Conference I'd like to have a roundtable discussion to share these ideas.

- ➤ Product Show tabletops vs booths, small venue (20-30 vendors) to larger venues (50-100)
- > Educational sessions AIA credits, consider providing sessions impactful for all groups (Owners/Designers/Contractors)
- > Combining efforts with associated industry groups AIA, USGBC, ABC, Builders Exchange, etc.
- > Food and drinks incorporating meals, buffets, snacks, beverages (food brings them in!)
- > Door prizes (must be present to win!)
- Sponsorships
- Advertising and invitations contact everyone in the design and construction industry in your area

## Attendee breakdown:

- ➤ Design (architect, engineer, specifier) 45 percent.
- ➤ Ownership (owner, property, and facility managers) 3 percent.
- ➤ Supply (building, product manufacturers, and representatives) 29 percent.
- ➤ Construction (general and sub-contractors, trades) 6 percent.
- ➤ Support (Lawyer, Consultant, Management) 5 percent.
- $\rightarrow$  Other (student, third party) 10 percent.
