CSI's Certifications: Construction Document Technologist (CDT), Certified Construction Contract Administrator (**CCCA**), Certified Construction Specifier (**CCS**), and Certified Construction Product Representative (**CCPR**).

CSI offers CDT, CCCA, CCPR, and CCS examinations twice annually in spring and fall. Open registration for the test begins in the winter and summer respectively.

ACADEMIC PROGRAMS CHAIR REPORT JANUARY 2023

Ghosts of Christmas Past: CSI Columbus Chapter

Many CSI Chapters have scholarships and programs designed to engage with learning and emerging professionals. As the Columbus Chapter fades into the rear-view mirror of the Construction Specifications Institute, we take a moment to look back aT some of the ways the chapter would reach out to the next generation of Built Environment.

Student Affiliate

CSI Columbus was one of the few chapters in the CSI system to have an active student affiliate. A student affiliate is a formal agreement between a CSI Chapter and a local learning Institution. These agreements include language in chapter by-laws recognizing students and student activities, the ability to hold election positions, voting, etc.

The Columbus CSI Chapter has had a collaboration with The Columbus State Community College that has spanned 18 years. This relationship provided a solid stream of students who interact with the parent chapter and beyond. Great Lakes Region President- Elect, Craig Stanton, is a former chapter officer the CSI-S at Columbus State.

These relationships begin as students are introduced to CSI thRough local members who visit classes and provide insight to what CSI is and what it provides to the industry. The students are invited to attend chapter functions, sit in on board meetings, and learn about the leadership of the chapter. These students often volunteer at golf outings and trade shows to get to know the local design community. Often the students are offered jobs through this type of interaction without going through a formal interview process since a relationship has developed.

Scholarships

The George A. Van Niel Student Scholarship. Traditionally awarded to three grad students from The Ohio State University's Knowlton School of Architecture. The submission criteria included a 50-question test on the CDT study materials, a written response to a product rep request for information from a fictitious job site situation, and constructing a 3-part spec for a fictitious project. These have included creative buildings like Igloos and temporary shelters for Occupy Wall Street. Three students each year walk away with CSI cash totaling \$2500.00

The Dean M. Bortz CSI, CDT Scholarship. Submission criteria include a recap of scholastic performance; letters of recommendation from teachers and local Industry leaders; an essay on why CSI and its formats are important to the Built Environment. Tie breaking score lean toward those who are CSI-S members and have committed time/energy to the organization. The chapter allocates \$750.00 to a winning student each year. Additional funds and awards vary each year from the efforts of Dean Bortz, FCSI, CDT, CCPR, MA and Margaret Owens, Ph D, who donates their time and 100% of the dollars collected from the CSI Columbus CDT Boot Camps held each CSI cycle. These selfless contributions mean the dollars awarded exceed the amounts awarded to OSU.
