

The recognition given to members can help stimulate membership at the chapter level by causing construction professionals in your area to understand that they are appreciated by CSI.

Awards to consider submitting for:

• Bud Reed Memorial Award - Individual in your chapter with distinguished service to the region – the region's highest honor

- Certificate of Appreciation For recognition of significant service to region
- Organizational Certificate of Appreciation Organization or firm with significant service to the region
- Region Commendation Outstanding service to the region
- Region Continuous Service At least 5 continuous year of service to the region

• **Region Cooperation Award** - Individual, chapter, firm, or organization for a singular outstanding accomplishment which promoted the objectives of the Institute or rendered outstanding service to the Region – submit your special Chapter event

• **Region Technical Commendation** - Individual, chapter, firm, or organization that has made a significant contribution to the technical program of the Region, or prepared notable technical documents

• **Region Educational Commendation** - Individual chapter, firm, or organization that has made a significant contribution to the field of education in areas related to the purposes of the Institute or a significant contribution to the education program of the Region

• **Region Student Liaison Award** - Individual, chapter, firm, or organization for encouraging the involvement of students form the various curricula of construction technology in the activity of the Institute

- **Region Craftsmanship Award** Outstanding craftsmanship on a project within the region
- Continuing Publication Commendation Outstanding continuous paper publication of interest or related to CSI

• **Special Publication Commendation** - Outstanding non-continuing paper publication of interest or related to CSI

• Electronic Media Award - Outstanding media publication

Remember that not all awards require the nominee to be a CSI member, so think about other individuals, educational institutions, firms, and businesses in your community that deserve to be recognized for their accomplishments in support of the mission of CSI. However, each nomination does require a narrative explaining why the nominee is deserving of the honor, so spend some time preparing this narrative to make sure the award criteria is met and is supported by the rest of the nomination package.

Submissions are due on Friday, March 24th and awards will be presented at the Great Lakes Region Conference in Cleveland, Ohio on April 20-22, 2023.

CSI April Program - Infection Control Risk Assessment (ICRA): Best Practices in Health Care Construction

This presentation will discuss some of the challenges faced during construction in health care facilities. Healthcare-Associated Infectious (HAIs) continue to be a top priority of the CDC and healthcare facilities. Federal, provincial, state, and local agencies as well as many organizations play active roles in the effort to reduce HAIs. Healthcare design, infection control professionals, and construction professionals play a major role in these efforts. Studies indicate that mold and other contaminates released during construction and renovation activities are responsible for a number of those infections. In the ICRA: Best Practices in Health Care Construction Course, construction personnel are made aware of their role within the healthcare environment. They are shown how their actions can help better protect themselves, staff, and patients during construction and renovation.

We will discuss the importance of a comprehensive and multidisciplinary approach to create an effective infection control program, examine an Infection Control Risk Assessment (ICRA) to determine the work type, patient risk group, and work classification as well as understand the importance of having a well-trained construction team and identify processes and procedures to ensure compliance with ICRA precautions. 1 AIA LU/HSW

Cleveland Chapter Creates Let's Build NE Ohio powered by CSI Foundation

In 2016, the Greater Lehigh Valley CSI Chapter founded an outreach to get young women interested in the construction industry. Founding pioneers, Jon Lattin, CDT, CCPR and Kristin Fallon garnered chapter support and created a program called Let's Build Construction Camp for Girls[®]. Their first camp had 20 attendees. Since then, they have hosted six camps impacting over 115 girls.

Let's Build attempts to ignite the spark within the girls to explore a career in the construction industry through architecture, engineering, construction, and building materials manufacturing (AECM) related activities. For one week each summer, these attendees gain exposure to the Built Environment in a real-world setting. They construct complete wall mock-ups, including framing, basic mechanicals, sheathing, air barrier, finished siding, flooring, drywall-finishing to a level four, and paint.

Local contractors and other CSI members are on hand to teach and provide instruction for each step. It became a huge success for the local chapter and community.

In 2020, it got the attention of the CSI Foundation. Members of the Foundation Board at the time agreed to support efforts to expand this program with both a formal program and funding others. The Greater Lehigh Valley Chapter model was used, and a pilot program was developed to share with CSI Chapters across the country.

Fast forward to 2022. The Cleveland CSI Chapter decided to access the program, creating Let's Build Construction Camp for Girls® NE Ohio, powered by the CSI Foundation. Shelly Higgins, CSI, Assoc AIA, IIBEC of S-5! Metal Roof Innovations spearheaded the effort, attacking the learning curve as the first CSI Chapter leader outside the Greater Lehigh Valley to use the "template" provided by the Foundation. Shelly's persistence was nothing short of amazing as she navigated the logistics of the donations needed, the volunteers required, the local outreach for campers, and the monetary needs of the week. John C. Workley, BA, BS, CSI, AIA, NCARB of Vocon Partners LLC and Great Lakes Region President, Scott Mitchell-Taylor, CSI, CDT of Conspectus Inc. assisted. All worked tirelessly to bring the event to fruition.

Jon Lattin and Janet Grazul were contacted to help fill in the blanks and were the epitome of good help. Jon attended the inaugural event with former camper Paige Knowles ("Plumber Paige") and provided hands-on leadership and support. The camp was held June 27 - July 1, 2022. All who attended the inaugural camp did so for free.

The results were stellar. The girls who attended reported they felt strong, confident, capable, and knowledgeable. Another piece of the circle were the parents who watched their children grow and learn throughout the week. Friendships were formed and dreams of working in the building industry were born. One parent said with tears in her eyes, "We could not afford to provide an experience or camp like this for our daughter. What you have done here is life changing for our family."

Shelly and the CSI Cleveland Chapter learned much through the process and plan to hold a similar event June 26-30, 2023. The Great Lakes Region is proud to have one of our Chapters be the first to access and use the Foundation's pilot program.
