PRESIDENT

- Direct and counsel the Board and committees.
- · Chairperson of Board Meetings
- Develop new ideas and methods for Region growth and improvement
- Act as spokesman for the Region
- Keep a pulse on what's going on in the Region Chapters

VICE - PRESIDENTS

- Act in the absence of the President and President-Elec.
- Act in the absence of the Treasurer.
- Assist in the operation of the Region as requested by the President / or President-Elec.

TREASURER

- Collect and receipt all monies and securities,
- Deposit funds and pay all bills, subject to the direction of the Board and Region budget.
- Keep accurate books with proper distribution to various accounts.
- Submit account for audit.
- Chairperson of the Finance/Budget Committee.
- Submit a monthly accounting of receipts, expenditures and bank balance at each Board Meeting.

Academic Programs Committee - Establish and maintain information to support the chapters in student/academic/emerging professional outreach.

Technical Committee - Monitor Institute technical content and programs for current information to pass on to Chapters through Region communications.

Awards Committee - Maintain region award Program and prepares materials.

PRESIDENT-ELEC

- · Act in the absence of the President.
- Be as familiar with all Region activities as the President.
- Assist in the operation of the Region as requested by the President.

SECRECTARY

- Record and distribute the minutes of all Board Meetings.
- · Maintain meeting agendas.
- Reports to the President and the Board.

REGION INSTITUE DIRECTOR

- Serve as an advocate and ambassador for CSI Institute.
- Prepare for, attend, and actively participate in meetings as directed by the CSI Board of Directors.
- Serve as Institute liaison communicator to the Region.

Education Committee - Monitor/create/share topics of interest for chapter education chairs. Update the "Education" PowerPoint in Leadership Training.

Region Conference Chair - The Region Conference chair is responsible for working with the host quadrant to establish the needs of the region at the annual conference.

Certification Chair - Monitor Institute certification programs, testing windows, and coming changes to certification.

These reports are critical to our ability to support chapters and regions overall, and we appreciate your sending them in before the **deadline – September 30**.


The CSI National team is committed to supporting chapter excellence with the initiatives above and looks forward to working with each of you to make your chapters and regions be the best they can be.
