
H. Griffith Edwards*, FCSI

H. GRIFFITH EDWARDS, Honorary Member, FAIA, was born in Columbia, S.C., August 21, 1907. He attended Cornell University in 1925-1927 and then attended the Georgia School of Technology and received a Bachelor of Science degree in 1930.

He was a partner in the firm of Edwards and Goodwyne in 1940-1941, principal of H. Griffith Edwards, Architects, from 1941 until 1955 when he joined the firm of Edwards and Portman. In 1969 he became president of that firm.

Edwards was a professor at the Georgia Institute of Technology, School of Architecture, from 1946 to 1969.

He was charter president of the Atlanta Chapter of CSI in 1957 and a director in 1958-1959.

He was author of "Specifications" published in 1953, revised 1961.

In addition to his CSI activities Edwards was a member of the Georgia Engineering Society, Atlanta Arts Institute, director and president of the Georgia Association of the American Institute of Architects and chairman of the Jury of Awards for Producers Council at the national AIA convention in 1962.
