JAMES EDWIN WELLS was born in Atlanta, Georgia, in 1908. He attended the Georgia School of Technology and received a Bachelor of Science degree in Architecture in 1930. After graduating from college, he worked in Atlanta with a number of firms designing homes and shopping centers in the southeast area.

In 1961 he became a partner in the firm of Toombs, Amisano and Wells with the primary responsibility of writing

specifications for many shopping centers and office buildings specialized in by the firm. He retired from practice in 1982.

Wells was a charter member of the Atlanta Chapter and a strong advocate of Master Guide Specifications. He received numerous awards for his chapter and the Southeast Region for his dedicated efforts in behalf of the Institute.

He was a member emeritus of the American Institute of Architects and belonged to St. Luke's Episcopal Church.
