LIVINGSTON E. (Woody) ATKINS, Jr., was born in 1918, and lived in Charlotte, North Carolina. He attended the University of Richmond, Virginia.

Prior to World War II, Atkins was employed by Virginia Electric and Power Company of Suffolk, Virginia, as a distribution engineer.

Woody was an officer in the US Army Air Forces in World War II.

In 1950, he established the manufacturers' representative firm of Woody Atkins Associates in Charlotte, North Carolina. He later worked for Lawrence Brothers, Inc., manufacturers' representatives for LCN, Sargent & Greenleaf, and the Exit Lock Company.

Atkins was a founding member of the Charlotte CSI Chapter in July 1958, and a charter member of the Raleigh, Knoxville, Columbia, and Winston-Salem chapters. He also assisted the formation of four other chapters.

He served on the Institute Awards Committee and was the first Industry Member to serve on the Institute Board of Directors. He was editor of the Charlotte Chapter's newsletter.

Woody also was active in the Producers Council, where he served as president, and in the Carolina Builders Hardware Club.

Atkins passed away 12 October 1999.
