ROBERT G. BURKHARDT was born in Chicago, Illinois, in 1922. He attended the Illinois Institute of Technology, graduating with a BS in Mechanical Engineering.

During World War II, Burkhardt served in the Engineer and Repair Department of the Submarine Force. From 1947 through 1950 he worked as a Mechanical Engineer with the firm of Graham, Anderson Probst & White, Architects and Engineers. From 1950 through 1952, he worked as resident engineer with the Cook County Architect, Raymond F.

Houlihan. In 1952, he joined the firm of Naess & Murphy, Architects & Engineers, working first as a field mechanical superintendent and later as a staff mechanical engineer.

In 1955, Burkhardt formed his own firm, Robert G. Burkhardt & Associates, Consulting Engineers, specializing in mechanical and electrical design of institutional, commercial, and industrial buildings.

Burkhardt passed away on 1 April 2008, in Chicago, Illinois.
