JOSEPH LINDEN HEACOCK, JR. was born in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania in 1909.

In 1930, Joseph began working as an assistant construction superintendent for John McShain, Inc. In 1936 he joined Heacock & Hokanson as a project inspector. With the onset of World War II he became an assistant plant engineer with the Cramp Ship Building Company. In 1944, he joined the War Shipping Administration as assistant to the Deputy Administrator of the Maintenance and Repair Division. After the war, he joined the firm of Heacock & Plan as a specifications writer.

Heacock became active with the group of CSI members that was attempting to form a CSI chapter in Philadelphia. When the chapter was chartered in February of 1957, he was elected

first chapter secretary. After two terms as secretary, he was elected to a two-year term as Chapter President.

In 1961, Joseph was elected to a two-year term on the Institute Board as Director representing Region 3.

In addition to his CSI activities, Heacock, was active in civic affairs. He served on the Hatboro, Pennsylvania board of governors, and as chairman of the Hatboro Business and Industrial Advisory Board. He also served as both treasurer and president of the Hatboro Rotary Club. He also was a member of the Valley Forge Council of the Boy Scouts of America.

Heacock passed away on 16 December 1982, in Hatboro, Pennsylvania.
