KELSEY YOUNG SAINT was born in Yakima, Washington in 1912. He attended Yale University, graduating with a Bachelor of Fine Arts degree in 1935. Originally a native of Washington, Saint was a Baltimore resident since 1950. He was a member of AIA and was a Lay Reader in the Episcopal Church.

Saint was a partner in the Baltimore architectural firm of Meyer, Ayres & Saint.

He was a charter member and co-founder of the Baltimore Chapter which was chartered in September of 1959. In 1960

he was elected Chapter Membership Secretary. In 1961 he was elected to the first of two terms as President of the young chapter.

In 1964 he was elected to the first of three terms as Institute Secretary. In 1965 he was appointed chairman of the newly established CSI/AGC Liaison Committee. In 1968 he was appointed to fill the vacancy of the office of Institute Vice President. The following year he was elected Institute President.

Kelsey passed away on 30 May 2006.
