WILLIAM PATERSON VICKERS was born in Paducah, Kentucky, in 1913. He attended Marin College in Kentfield, California, Alberta College in Edmonton, Canada, the University of California in Berkley, the City College and State College in Sacramento, and the Art Institute in Chicago.

Vickers worked for a variety of firms in all aspects of the practice of architecture before becoming associated with the State of California Department of General Services, Office of Architecture and Construction, in Sacramento.

Vickers was active in the Sacramento chapter CSI, serving as chapter President and in a variety of other areas.

After serving as chair of CSI's Committee T-1 for Specification Methods and the CSI format, Vickers was elected to a three-year term on the Institute Board.

In 1961, William won first place in the national specification competition, Public Buildings category. Vickers also was active in the American Institute of Architects, the Architectural Club of San Francisco, and the Amateur Astronomers Society.

Vickers passed away on 22 April 1998 in Hernando, Florida.
