DONALD EUGENE PAINE was born in Tacoma, Washington, in 1910, and graduated from Stadium High School in 1928. He worked for Cavanaugh Lumber Co., Tacoma, as a draftsman estimator from 1935 to 1940. He then moved to Olympia, Washington, where he became manager of Rowland Lumber Co.

During WWII, Donald worked for Todd-Pacific Shipbuilding Co., Tacoma, as administrative engineering office manager. After the war, he worked at Wohleb and Wohleb Associates as draftsman and specifier from 1947 to 1961.

Paine obtained his architectural registration in 1957, and opened own office in 1987. He was a consultant to architects, engineers, manufacturers, and public bodies, specializing in specifications. He retired in 1987.

Donald joined CSI as a member at large. In 1958, he and other CSI members in the Seattle area formed the Puget Sound Chapter.

In 1962, he was elected Institute Director for Region 12. In 1965, he was elected Institute Vice President. He held numerous Region and Institute posts and was active in educational activities.

In 1966, Donald was awarded a CSI Citation for the preparation of Weyerhaeuser Wood Products Manual Specifications and Technical Data Sheets.

The Puget Sound Chapter's highest award, for exemplary service to the chapter, is named in his honor.

Paine passed away on 22 September 1993, in Olympia, Washington.
