"In recognition of your distinguished service to the Institute, as a founder, organizer, charter president and director of the Indianapolis Chapter, as a region conference leader and panelist, as the Institute Director of Region 6, as a member of the Convention Technical Program Committee for the 1964, 1965, and 1966 conventions, for active contribution and counsel in the formation of the Louisville, Grand Rapids, Toledo, and Dayton-Miami Valley Chapters, and for pioneering efforts in support of the CSI Format in the State of Indiana, you are advanced to Fellowship in the Institute on this 10th day of June, 1970."



JOHN C. FLECK was born in 1925 in Indianapolis, Indiana. He entered the Army Air Corps in 1943 and served as a pilot until October 1945. He then studied pre-engineering and architecture at Purdue and the Universities of Illinois and Colorado.

After working in Oklahoma, Fleck returned to Indiana and opened his own architectural firm. In 1986 he became Executive Director of the Indiana State Office Building Commission.

Fleck was one of the seven founders of the Indianapolis CSI Chapter and served as its founding President from 1961 through 1962. He also served the Chapter in many other capacities.

In 1968 he was elected to the Institute Board of Directors, and served a three-year term. In 1972 he was elected Institute Vice-President and was elected Institute President the following year.

Fleck was active in all aspects of the construction industry and has received awards from many organizations other than CSI.

Fleck passed away on 10 July 2013.
