WOODWARD GARBER was a resident of Glendale, Ohio. Garber was a partner in the architectural firm of Woodie Garber, Hughes, & Associates in Cincinnati. His practice was nationally recognized for its provocative construction accomplishments.

Garber first joined CSI in 1957 when he became a charter member of the Cincinnati chapter. He served that chapter as president and vice president. He has also served on a number of Institute and region committees. In 1968 he was asked to chair the Institute's Advisory Committee.

Garber was a frequent lecturer at the University of Cincinnati's College of Art and Architecture. He also lectured on design, architectural practice, the construction industry, and specification writing at other universities.

Garber also was active in a number of other organizations. For many years he was vice chair of the Ohio State Board of Building Standards. He was a member of the Cincinnati chapter of the American Institute of Architects. In 1961 and 1965, Garber received the Cincinnati Chapter AIA's Silver Award for design excellence. He was a member of the Scarab Architectural Society, and the Library Club of Cincinnati.
