MAXWELL LESTER SAUL was born in New York City, and grew up in Brooklyn. He joined the Army Air Corp after graduating from high school. He trained as a gunner in the B-29 at Lowry Air Force Base in Denver, Colorado.

After leaving the Air Corp, he attended the University of Denver and received a Bachelor of Architecture and Planning degree in 1951. He later spent considerable time in Europe in independent study in the field of architecture.

Saul was a licensed architect and principal in the Denver architectural firm of Maxwell L Saul & Associates. He designed schools around the world, housing for the elderly, and, later in his career, correctional institutions.

Maxwell became a member of CSI in 1959 when he helped organize the Denver Chapter. He served the chapter as Vice President and President.

In 1963, Saul was elected Institute Director for Region 10. During his three year term, he actively promoted the Institute's objectives throughout the Rocky Mountain Region.

One of Saul's special projects was Casa Dos Palmas, his home in Litibu, Mexico. The Sauls frequently shared this home with their friends.

Saul also was active in the affairs of the American Institute of Architects and other construction related organizations. He was a member of the Denver Art Museum, the Denver Symphony Society, Friends of Contemporary Art, the Fraternal Order of Elks, and the City Club of Denver.

Saul passed away 26 April 2022, in Aurora, Colorado.
