DONALD W. MANLEY was born in 1934 in Memphis, Tennessee, where he graduated from high school in 1952. He entered Rice Institute in Houston, Texas, and graduated in 1956 with a Bachelor of Arts degree and a commission in the U.S. Navy. After two years of active duty in the Office of Naval Intelligence, he returned to Rice Institute and received a Bachelor of Science in Architecture degree in 1959.

He, his wife, and two daughters returned to Memphis in December 1960, and he was employed with a firm designing schools, commercial buildings, and shopping centers. He became a licensed architect in 1961.

In 1963, he joined the Memphis Chapter of CSI and became active immediately, serving as Chairman, Technical Documents Committee, followed by the offices of First Vice President and President. During that time, he assisted in the

formation and chartering of the Mississippi and Little Rock Chapters. Also, he was co-chairman of the first region conference for Region 5.

He was elected Region Director for the term of 1969-72. In 1973 he was advanced to Fellowship in the Institute. He served on the Institute Nominating Committee 1973-75, and the Jury of Fellows in 1983-85 and was Chairman of the Jury of Fellows in 1985-86.

In 1990, Donald was the first recipient of the Gulf States Region's highest award, the Robert V. Bishop Award. The Memphis Chapter's highest award, The Donald W. Manley Award, was named for and presented to him in 1993.

Manley passed away 27 October 2012, in Memphis, Tennessee.
