CHARLES CHIEF BOYD was born in Amarillo, Texas, in 1940, the son of a cowboy and a Cherokee Indian. He graduated from high school in Borger, Texas, in 1958, then entered the University of Colorado and received a Bachelor of Architecture degree in 1964.

Boyd's graduating thesis was designs for a new Cherokee Heritage Center in Tahlequah, Oklahoma, and he had the privilege of seeing his thesis through construction. After years of working with various architectural firms, he formed The Boyd Group in 1978. In the early 1980s he became one of the founding partners of BSW International, which grew to a staff of nearly 600.

Boyd is one of the founding Principals of Thalden Boyd Emery (TBE) Architects in St. Louis, Missouri.
