GARY DEAN CHURCH was born in 1947, and is a resident of Colorado Springs, Colorado. He was an electrical engineer, and is president of Consulting Engineers, Inc., Colorado Springs. His firm has designed building electrical and lighting systems for office buildings, schools, performing arts centers, hospitals, recreation centers, and more. Most of their work has been in Colorado, but they also worked in many other states.

Gary is most widely known throughout the industry for his work on CSI's SpecText Committee. In 1985, Church was appointed a member of the committee. Two years later, due to his enthusiastic participation, he was appointed chair. His first undertaking was to complete SpecText Divisions 15 and 16, which were missing vital sections.

In addition, Church was instrumental in launching the Site-Civil Engineering Package, a selected collection of SpecText sections used most by civil engineers. This was the Institute's first attempt at targeting the master guide specifications needs of engineers. As chair, Church succeeded in completing another goal-improved communication between CSI's

Technical Documents Committee and the Construction Sciences Research Foundation. These two groups closely coordinated parallel documents such as SpecGUIDEs and SpecText sections.

During his three years as SpecText Committee Chair, Church actively participated in other Institute committees, including the Long-Range Planning Committee and the Ad Hoc MasterFormat Review Committee.

Church was active in his chapter and region, serving as Pikes Peak Chapter President and Southwest Region Conference co-chair. During his term as chapter president, Church revitalized the slipping membership and organized the chapter's first trade show, returning the chapter's treasury to solvency.

Church's dedication extends not only to CSI, but to advancing construction technology throughout the entire industry. His involvement with seven other construction industry associations enables him to share his technical knowledge with his fellow professionals.
