


# Anthony Bruno\*, FCSI

ANTHONY (Tony) PAUL BRUNO was born in Rosedale, New York, in 1933, where his family owned a construction firm. He graduated from Far Rockaway High School in Queens, and later received degrees from the Pratt Institute, Columbian University in Manhattan, and the Institute of Design and Construction in Brooklyn. He served in the United States Army, reaching the rank of Private First Class.

After graduation, Bruno worked at various architecture firms on Long Island, rising from Job Captain to Project Architect. He administered the construction of many schools on Long Island and in New Jersey. In 1994, he formed his own firm, Design Build Collaborative, in Levittown, and offered multi-disciplined consulting services. He was a member of the Long Island Chapter AIA, and the New York State Association of Architects.

CSI was the highlight of his volunteer efforts. He saw a need for a suburban chapter and organized the Long Island Chapter in 1970. He recruited others, and was proud to be a charter

member. He served on the Board of Directors, and was elected Chapter President twice. He was the Dean of the Chapter's Certification program and seminars. His lectures and seminars on "The Pitfalls of Construction Specifications and Beyond" were known throughout the northeast region, and he taught certification courses to architects and engineers from his home.

In 1994, in recognition of his exemplary service, the Long Island Chapter established the "Anthony P. Bruno FCSI Distinguished Service Award." This is presented every other even year by a member of the Bruno family. Tony gave the presentations in 1994 and 1996. He continued his efforts on behalf of CSI through the region and the Institute while still serving his chapter.

His service to the region was always positive; he was an inspiration and example to everyone.

Bruno passed away on 23 October 1996, in Manhasset, New York.
