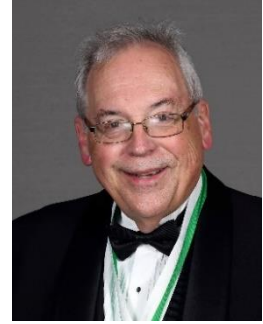


# Jack Morgan, FCSI

JACK PHILIP MORGAN graduated from Ball State University with a Bachelor of Architecture Degree in 1973. He became an architect in Indiana in 1977, where he continues to practice architecture and to write specifications.

Jack determined early that CSI was *the* organization that would improve his career. In 2001, after attending a course organized by the Indianapolis Chapter - "How to Prepare Good Specifications" - Jack realized that this group, unlike other organizations he belonged to at the time, could help his career.

In return, by dedicating himself to help others in their careers and in leadership positions, Jack helped CSI become stronger. His biggest regret was not discovering CSI sooner in his career, as he was 51 when he joined.

After joining the Indianapolis Chapter, Jack took the next CDT class and passed that examination; this led him to pass both the CCS and CCCA exams. He was so motivated to help others that he joined his chapter's Certification Committee and has been a member ever since. He helped several candidates pass the CDT, CCS, and CCCA examinations. Jack considers certification to be CSI's greatest strength, and

he writes certification questions that appear in the Indianapolis Chapter and Great Lakes Region newsletters.

It did not take Jack long to be placed in a leadership position in the Indianapolis Chapter. He was Program Chair for many years and was considered very good in this position for organizing many successful programs with the programs committee.

Jack worked his way through the offices of treasurer, vice-president, president, and past president of the chapter before turning his attention to region leadership and joining the Institute Education Committee. He later joined the Institute Audit and Awards committees, where he continues to serve. Jack served as a non-fellow member on CSI's Jury of Fellows for two years.

While Great Lakes Region president, Jack continued developing a series of leadership PowerPoint presentations that were started by Thad Goodman. These presentations are used at the Great Lakes region conferences to help train future leaders.
