He started his career in 1984 as a mechanical designer with Assaf, Simoneaux & Tauzin Consulting Engineers in Baton Rouge, then moved on to Pruett & Ford Consulting Engineers in Augusta, Georgia. From there, Bergeron went to Johnson Controls Facility Management division, where he was the manager of a 90-person maintenance and repair department for 1,400 buildings at Fort Gordon, Georgia (renamed Fort Eisenhower in 2022), for approximately two years. Gary then worked for Albert F.G. Bedinger Engineers in Knoxville, Tennessee, for four years. He then accepted a position with Kelso-Regen & Associates in the spring of 1995, and became co-owner of the firm.

Gary attended the International Ground Source Heat Pump Association (IGSHPA) School in 1997, where he became a member of the association and also learned about the design and installation of geothermal heat pumps, piping, and wellfields.
