NORMAN KRUCHKOW was born in 1916, in Brooklyn, New York, and was a resident of Stamford, Connecticut. He received his degree in civil engineering from New York University in 1938. He took a position at the New York firm of McKee-Berger-Mansueto, Inc., construction consultants and professional engineers.

As president of his chapter, Kruchkow originated an Institute-NYU Specifications Seminar for professional specification writers and acted as faculty member in the program.

He made a number of contributions to the construction industry through his development of specifications. One of the most notable of these was the development, design, and specifications for a unique "Vertical Assembly Building Curtainwall at Cape Kennedy." The wall was designed to withstand winds of 120 miles per hour, and to be maintenance free for 20 years.

Kruchkow passed away on 6 April 2004, in Brooklyn, New York.
