GEORGE FRANKLIN WINSLOW was born in 1902, in Allston, Massachusetts. By 1920, his family had moved to Sacramento, California. George's father was a state civil engineer, and George followed in his footsteps. In 1930, he worked for a railroad company in Sacramento. By 1940, he was working for the California Department of Highways.

Winslow the Sacramento Chapter in 1956 and served the organization in a number of capacities. He was active in regional affairs of the organization, and served on several Institute committees. He contributed to Institute technical programs with research papers, and authored a number of technical articles for publication in chapter and Institute publications. He also produced a number of chapter publications.

Winslow was active in a number of other organizations in the area. He was a member of the Sacramento Mineral Society,

and was its president in 1953-1954. He was a member of the Capitol City Toastmasters Club, where he served as president in 1958, and of the Ambassadors Club of Sacramento. He was a member of the Masonic Lodge, and reached the Scottish Rite in 1968.

George retired in 1969. Afterward, he and his wife traveled extensively. They went on a world tour that included visits to the Kreuger Game Reserves, Mt. Hoy in the Belgian Congo, Angkor Wat and Angkor Tom, Hong Kong, Japan, and Hawaii. Another trip saw them visit the Easter Islands and Pitcairn Island. They also visited Israel and South America. He was president of the Sacramento Travel Club.

Winslow passed away on 14 May 1986, in Sacramento, California.
