





FINANCIAL UPDATE

FINANCIAL UPDATE CSI ANNUAL REPORT 2021-2022

OVERVIEW

CSI, the CSI Foundation, and the Construction Information Network, LLC continue to make strides and maintain an overall positive financial outlook with \$11,713,907 in assets. Although 2022 expenses exceeded revenue, this deficit was paid for by board-authorized transfers from income realized in FY21. The board allocated \$891,975 that supports the strategic building of essential programs and benefits.



REVENUE

Non-dues revenue accounted for 71 percent of CSI's consolidated income, meaning that membership contributed 29 cents for every dollar of the association's income. Out of the 71 percent of income, 65 percent was attributed to product sales, conferences, sponsorships, and education programs, and 6 percent was attributed to interest and dividends, contributions, and other income.

EXPENSES

Expenses in Fiscal Year 2022 included support for conferences, marketing, technical programs, education, product sales, member services, association governance, and strategic initiatives. While the total expense exceeds income by \$2.8 million, it is important to note that this deficit was a planned shortfall, and the difference was made up by the board-approved transfers of revenue earned in prior fiscal years.

OVERVIEW

The CSI Foundation is a 501(c)(3) tax-exempt organization that supports research, education, and scholarships related to workforce development and construction industry leadership.



Most notable is the Let's Build Construction Camp for Girls, a program designed for middle to high school-aged girls to attend a free week-long camp to explore the construction trades through hands-on experiences and field trips. With only 10 percent of the AECO industry represented by women, the camp is just one way CSI is helping find ways to build a more gender-diverse workforce. As a result of their engagement in the program, several women who enjoyed the program are now working in the industry.

This year, through a generous grant received, The Foundation was able to support the formation of two new camps, helping to further our goal. In addition to the Let's Build Construction Camp for Girls, The Foundation also funds and supports emerging professionals and students through the Student and Emerging Professionals (SEP) Fund and the Moll/Betts Student Excellence Fund.
