<u>Speaker Bio:</u>

Medgar Marceau joined Morrison Hershfield in 2008 with a unique mix of building envelope, energy modeling and life cycle assessment experience. In addition to Medgar's building science expertise, he has extensive experience in whole building energy simulation, building envelope systems, life-cycle assessment (LCA) and material science including infrared thermographic analysis, modeling of air and moisture transfer through envelope systems, air leakage, and mass transfer. He is an expert on concrete structures and material properties of concrete and has conducted numerous investigations on concrete failure. Medgar has authored and co-authored dozens of publications on the subjects of life-cycle assessment, commercial and residential energy use, and sustainability. Medgar's sustainability goal is to help designers increase building durability and reduce building energy consumption.

Synopsis of Presentation

How to Optimize the Envelope: A focus on renewable energy and mechanical efficiency to improve performance frequently overlooks the enclosure which is more permanent, rarely replaced, part of the building. This presentation introduces strategies for increasing energy performance and decreasing carbon emissions by improving the building enclosure. Strategies addressed will include minimizing heat loss through massing, orientation, and glazing, as well as reducing air leakage and thermal bridging. It talks about design strategies as well as frequent weak points in the performance of enclosures.

PROSPEC 2022 live and in person! March 22nd was our 35th annual tradeshow for the 17th year at the Bell Harbor Conference Center. We had 35 attendees for the AIA accredited Seminar, a sellout of 33 Exhibitors at display tables, and 180 meals ordered for dinner. It was our first in person chapter meeting in two years, except for an onsite tour last Oct. Thank you, ProSpec Committee. Reviews say we were a success!

CSI structure change is coming! It has been mentioned in these messages before and is described on the Institute website HERE. Key dates in the next four months are: April 4th - Current members receive information related to the transition, May 1st - First invoices deployed for July 2022 Renewals, June 9th -Deadline for PSC Board to authorize signing Affiliation Agreement (new chapter charter), June 30th – Deadline for Chapter President's to sign Affiliation Agreement, July 1st - Changes go live. As with all change that happens, there is some angst that comes with it as members, chapters, and regions have various opinions about: home chapter membership, elimination of chapter dues, chapter zip code assignments, how chapters are chartered, relevancy of CSI, and the list goes on and on.

Chapter awards! After two years of online award presentations, the Awards Committee wants to have a live special event to celebrate the PSC year. Nora Vivarelli is chair. Please get your nominations to her by April 28th so the committee can make selections, get Board approval May 12th, and obtain the items to present June 9th. Annual chapter award brief summaries are:

- Cooperation Award, given to a firm, that has best worked with the chapter.
- **Finnegan Award**, given to a member, for specification proficiency in one's practice.
- **Schuman Award**, given to a member, who made substantial impact on our membership.
- Thomas Award, given toamember, that distinguishes themselves in their industry toward the service of the chapter's goals and mission.
- Hallett Award, given to a member, in recognition of highest outstanding service to the chapter.

Be all you can be! At PROSPEC 2022, I concluded the event with this message: "Be more than just busy at work. Make time to give back to others." So many of our members and associates have said they are swamped in the office, their staff is shorthanded, or we scramble to keep up with work and family life. 




