

Bio:


Have a BS in Biology and a BA in Design and Architecture. I worked as a Biologist for 6 years and have been practicing Architecture for 22 years. I was one of the first in the nation to be LEED accredited. I have been interested in specs ever since I got into an argument with



Ed Storer during my 8-year tenure at NBBJ, who told me to "read the damn specs." That opened the door to the absolute power on the construction site and I was hooked! I started with marking up specs for Don Schuman (Schuman!!!! – loved him too!), asking endless questions of Beth Stroshane, and sitting in on a CDT class for free (since NBBJ allowed Ed Storer to use their space). And I found my calling. I love the organization of specs, of knowing how to apply the materials, and it helps I took a crap-load of chemistry classes for my Biology degree, which helped me understand what the hell sealants actually *do*. I now specify Door Hardware for Assa Abloy and have for the last 2.5 years. It's more than just door knobs. It's about life safety and getting people successfully out of a flaming building. It was the next stepping stone in Architecture for advancement (in my mind). So now I am THAT guy who sits in the windowless basement.

Personal story: I went back to school for Architecture to build hospitals. My Grandma Pressley fell and broke her leg at home, and the family put her in a nursing home: the most depressing and dismal places on Earth. Whenever I build places that make people feel comfortable, and safe, and not just a place to transition to death, it makes me feel I am giving people hope and comfort in their greatest time of need.

Technically... John Aldredge of LMN on the Origin of Words

It's a sad thing, but in my profession we have to include provisions for anti-graffiti treatment in every project.

graffiti – plural of graffito. Markings, as initials, slogans, or drawings, written, spray-painted, or sketched on a sidewalk, wall of a building or public restroom, or the like. 1851, "ancient wall inscriptions found in the ruins of Pompeii," from Italian graffiti, plural of graffito "a scribbling," a diminutive formation from graffio "a scratch or scribble," from graffiare "to scratch," ultimately from Greek graphein "to scratch, draw, write". Usually without permission and in public view; often over history to express a political view but now largely to mark turf.

We typically use a clear liquid material that closes the pores of concrete or concrete block – the graffiti can then be cleaned off with various solvents or other cleaners. In the spirit of "scratching" some members of the public use diamonds to scratch "touch zone" glass in architectural projects – there are clear replaceable films that can be applied to the glass to stop that.
