

0915-1000 Care of the Pediatric Trauma Patient: Specific Concerns in Triage, Monitoring & Management - Dimitra Lotakis, MD

Dimitra is a third-generation Greek-American, born and raised in rural Alaska. After moving to Washington State at the age of 11, she became heavily involved in mixed martial arts and lacrosse. She had the pleasure of completing both undergraduate and medical education at the University of Washington, including time off working as a research scientist in the Department of Medical Genetics. Upon concluding medical school, she relocated to New York City for General Surgery training with New York Medical College-Metropolitan Hospital Center. the beautiful Flathead Valley. 



Meghan Sutton is a Family Nurse Practitioner working in Detroit, Michigan. She received her BSN from Kent State University in 2009 and worked as a RN for 7 years in inpatient care. With a desire to change to outpatient care she went on to graduate from Oakland University in 2016 with a MSN. Receiving her certification as a FNP through the American Academy of Nurse Practitioners. Currently employed through Detroit Medical Center, she has been working in the Adult Burn Center since 2017. The focus of her work is the outpatient management of burns and other related diagnoses. This specialty includes burns sustained by thermal, chemical, electrical, friction, and inhalation injuries.



Dr. Jennifer Peltzer-Jones is the Assistant Medical Director of Emergency Behavioral Services for the Department of Emergency Medicine for Henry Ford Health System. She first earned her bachelor's degree in the Science of Nursing (BSN) from De Sales University in 1997 and went on to obtain a master's degree in the Science of Clinical Psychology (MS) from Millersville University in 1999, and a Doctor of Psychology Degree (PsyD) from La Salle University in 2006. She moved from her hometown of Philadelphia to Michigan in 2005 to complete 3 years of pre-doctoral internship/post-doctoral fellowship in Health Psychology. She was hired as the first Health Psychologist to work directly for the Department of Emergency Medicine and remains one of only a handful of Psychologists in the country in such a position. Dr. Peltzer-Jones' is the elected representative of the Michigan Psychological Association for the national American Psychological Association's Council of Representatives. She is a locally and nationally recognized advocate for improving emergency behavioral health care and participates in multiple hospital, community, and State projects focused on improving mental health access and care. She created the first trauma psychology service within Henry Ford Health System's Level 1 Trauma center, working with patients immediately post-acute trauma delivering secondary preventions to mitigate the risk of developing post-

traumatic stress disorder.

Dr. Peltzer-Jones has researched and published in areas such as emergency department frequent utilizers, psychiatric medical clearance, and more recently, sources of burnout in emergency department physicians during the COVID19 pandemic. Her first research project – her doctoral dissertation – examined nursing burnout as being a nurse herself, she recognized the need to develop interventions for this phenomenon. Over the last 2 years of the pandemic, she has been especially focused on the experiences of ED staff and how they are (or not) caring for themselves during this time. She has been researching positive psychology and mindfulness principles in order to find ways to deliver and have staff accept such mental health practices.
