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## I. <u>POLICY PURPOSE:</u>

- a. To protect a member who reports activity viewed as unlawful or unethical from retaliatory action.
- b. To offer a member a mechanism to report such activity.
- c. To ensure that the Michigan ENA is as compliant as possible with the Sarbanes-Oxley Act of 2002.

## II. <u>STANDARDS/CRITERIA:</u>

Michigan ENA, including its officers, will not take retaliatory action against any member for reporting suspected or actual occurrence(s) of illegal, unethical, or inappropriate events, behaviors, or practices.

## III OPERATIONAL PROCEDURE:

- a. If any member of Michigan ENA believes that some policy, practice, or activity of Michigan ENA is in violation of the law, the member must file a written complaint with the president.
- b. It will then be determined who is responsible for investigating and notification of any additional authorities.
- c. A member reporting suspected unlawful or unethical activity is to exercise sound judgment to avoid baseless allegations.
- d. The whistleblower is protected from retaliation based on reporting activity in accordance with this policy and procedure.
- e. The right of a whistleblower for protection against retaliation does not include immunity for any personal wrongdoing that is alleged and investigated.
