GEOMORPHOLOGISTS SEEK APPLICATIONS FOR MACKIN GRANT

The Mackin grant for research in geomorphology will be given for the first time beginning this fall. A stipend of not less than \$200 will be given as a cash grant to assist promising graduate student research.

Applications will be received by the Quaternary Geology and Geomorphology Division not later than October 1, 1974. Since the grant is intended for graduate student research, applicants should be nominated by supervising faculty. Each department submitting applications will be asked to screen them first and indicate priorities.

Application forms may be obtained from the Division Secretary, Don J. Easterbrook, Geology Department, Western Washington State College, Bellingham, Washington 98225. The form includes a résumé of the applicant, statement of proposed research, and a letter of reference from the thesis advisor. Applications will be evaluated by the Management Board and the grantee will be announced at the annual GSA meeting in Miami Beach.

To avoid conflict with restrictions imposed by the GSA Council concerning the number of awards given by the Society, and to avoid confusion between this grant and the GSA research grants program, the Mackin grant will be handled entirely as a Division matter. Applicants for the grant, successful or unsuccessful, will be free to apply for grants within the regular GSA program.

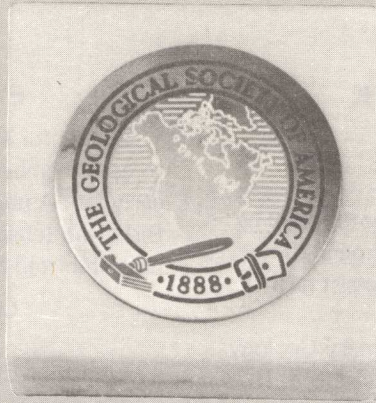

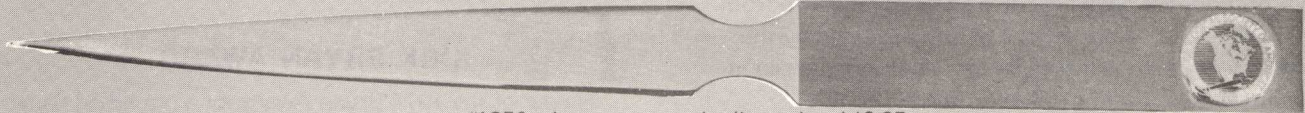
