KIRK BRYAN AWARD

The QG&G Panel selected G. S. Boulton, Norwich, England, as winner of the 1976 Kirk Bryan Award for his 1974 paper "Processes and patterns of glacial erosion," 5th Geomorphology Symposium Proceedings, Binghamton, New York. Presentation of the award will be made at the Division business meeting and luncheon that will be held during the GSA annual meeting in Denver, Colorado, November 8-11, 1976.

MACKIN GRANT

Philip T. Davis, University of Colorado, has been awarded the 1975 Mackin grant for research in geomorphology.

The 1976 Mackin grant for research in geomorphology will be given this fall. A stipend of not less than \$200 will be given as a cash grant to assist promising graduate student research.

Applications will be received by the QG&G Division no later than October 1, 1976. Since the grant is intended for graduate student research, applicants should be nominated by supervising faculty. Each department submitting applications will be asked to screen them first and indicate priorities.

Application forms may be obtained from the Division Secretary, Don J. Easterbrook, Geology Department, Western Washington State College, Bellingham, Washington, 98225. The form includes a resume of the applicant, statement of proposed research, and a letter of reference from the thesis advisor. Applications will be evaluated by the Management Board; the grantee will be announced at the GSA annual meeting.

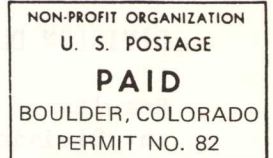
