GSA EVENTS: ANNUAL AND SECTION MEETINGS

We would like to remind everybody that the <u>2019 GSA Annual Meeting</u> will be held **September 22-25 in Phoenix**, **AZ**, and that the dates for this conference are much earlier than normal. This means that all conference-related deadlines are also earlier than normal and some of them are arriving quite soon. The deadline to propose **Topical Sessions**, **Short Courses**, and **Field Trips** is February 1, 2019. If you are thinking of proposing a geoscience education session for the conference and would like division sponsorship please use the division sponsorship request form (<u>click here</u>) and then submit your proposal to GSA (<u>click here</u>).

One of our division goals for the year is increase the division's presence at GSA Sectional Meetings. Sectional Meetings provide an excellent opportunity for the geoscience education community to connect with folks who would not normally travel to the annual meeting.
