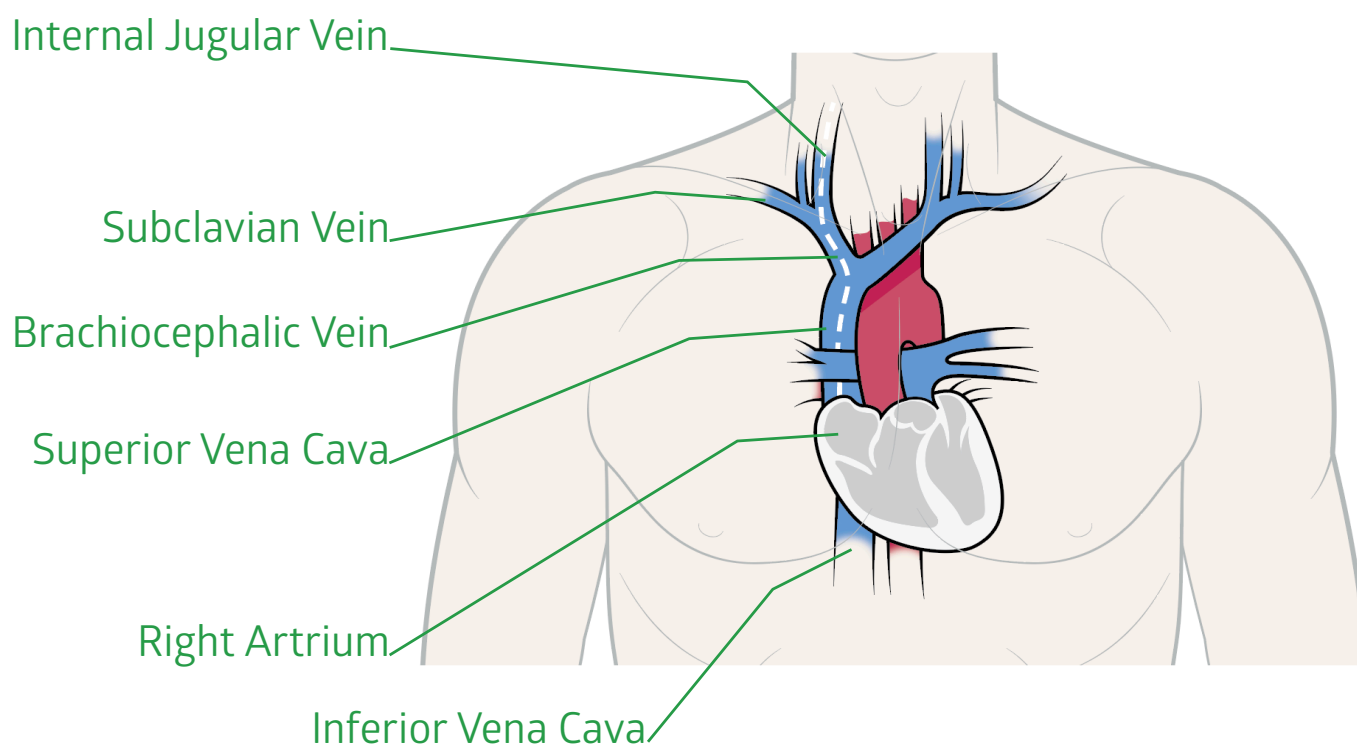


What makes a catheter central



Two indicators in tandem will indicate whether a catheter is centrally located or not.

1. Insertion location: Placed in arm, chest, neck, and groin.
2. Tip terminates in the Superior Vena Cava (SVC) or Inferior Vena Cava (IVC).
