





Faster turnover times improve OR efficiency

- **1.** Observe facility OR turnover process for better insight as to what might be causing an increase in turnover times.
- **2.** Assign roles and responsibilities during turnovers to prevent repeated work efforts and easy delegation during breaks.
- **3.** Use of turnover kits and/or turnover carts for easy access of supplies.
- 4. Consider switching to a disinfectant with a faster dry time.
- **5.** Use of tracker boards and/or communication devices to inform staff of room status (e.g., procedure in progress, closing, dirty, ready for next patient, etc.).
- **6.** Use of an available float person (RN/ST) during case set up.
- **7.** Presort open/hold instruments and supplies. Label accordingly by staff pulling case load.
- **8.** Open sterile supplies in designated area on back table to provide scrub technician space to setup case, eliminating excessive touch points.
- **9.** Track progress and post weekly updates. Reward staff who meet goals set by leadership.
- **10.** Include process and procedure as part of unit orientation for all new staff members.
