



Q1: Should MOC be a continuous process or a periodic assessment?






Q2: If MOC included a periodic assessment, should it be a secure examination?





Q3: Is documented CME provided by accredited organizations sufficiently rigorous to qualify as "keeping up"?






Q5: Do you believe these MOC elements adequately measure the competence of a physician?




Q7: Do you think "grandfathers/grandmothers" should be strongly encouraged to participate in a formal MOC process to maintain certification?






Q8: If a "grandfather/grandmother" opts not to participate in an MOC process, should that be indicated on the public record?
