Mukesh K. Jain is the Ellery Sedgwick Jr. Chair & Distinguished Scientist, Vice Dean for Medical Sciences, and Professor in the Department of Medicine at Case Western Reserve University. He is widely recognized for pioneering studies establishing KLF proteins as nodal regulators of metabolism, immunity, and the cardiovascular system. He has translated this work from animals to humans and established KLFs as key pharmacologic targets for therapeutic gain. His work has been published in top-tier peer-reviewed journals and he has been continuously supported for 15 years through funding from the National Institutes of Health (including the Outstanding Investigator Award), American Heart Association (including the Established Investigator Award), and the American Diabetes Association.

Dr. Jain is an elected member of the American Society for Clinical Investigation (ASCI), American Association of Physicians (AAP), Association of University Cardiologist (AUC), and National Academy of Medicine (NAM). He is also the recipient of numerous honors including the American Heart Association's Honorary Russell Ross Memorial Lectureship in Vascular Biology (2012), the North American Vascular Biology Organization's Judah Folkman Award in Vascular Biology (2015), and the SUNY Buffalo Distinguished Alumnus Award (2016). Dr. Jain is past President of the American Society for Clinical Investigation, one of the oldest honorific physician societies in the country. He is a gifted mentor with mentorship awards from Harvard Medical School and University Hospitals, Cleveland.
