Dr. Christopher Williams is the Associate Dean for Physician-Scientist Education and Training and Associate Professor of Medicine, Gastroenterology and current director of the Medical Scientist Training Program (MSTP) and associate director of the Harrison Society (PSTP/ABIM Research Pathway) at Vanderbilt University. His clinical interests are in the management of inflammatory bowel disease and in the prevention of IBD related complications, specifically colitis-associated carcinoma. His research program is focused on intestinal injury response/repair programs with the goal of understanding how these epithelial integrity programs are perturbed in the pathogenesis of IBD and more importantly in the progression to malignancy with the overarching goal of identifying novel therapeutic targets or biomarkers in this disease. Dr. Williams received his undergraduate degree from Brigham Young University before matriculating to Vanderbilt University as trainee in the MSTP. He was selected for the ABIM Research Pathway Residency and received sub-specialty training in Gastroenterology, joining the Vanderbilt faculty in 2007.
