Norman Meonske, Ph.D. Professor Emeritus, Kent State University

Robert H. Herz, CPA, CGMA, FCA Former Chair, FASB

Robert H. Herz's current activities include serving on the boards of directors and various board committees of Fannie Mae (chairman of Audit Committee), Morgan Stanley (chairman of Audit Committee), Workiva Inc., Paxos, the Sustainability Accounting Standards

Board Foundation, on the Independent Investment Committee of UNOPS, on the advisory boards of AccountAbility and Libra Services, Inc., as an ambassador for the International Integrated Reporting Council, and as a member of the Audit Committee Chair Advisory Council of the National Association of Corporate Directors. He is also an executive-inresidence and member of the faculty of the Columbia Business School and from 2006-2017 he served on the Advisory Board of the Alliance Manchester Business School in England. He also serves on the Standing Advisory Group of the U.S. Public Company

Earlier, he served as a professional accounting fellow in the Office of the Chief Accountant and prior to that held various audit and professional practice positions at PwC, including in the firm's national office during the global financial crisis advising on complex financial accounting matters.

Former Chairman Pitt received his JD from St. John's University School of Law in 1968, and his BA from the City University of New York, Brooklyn College, in 1965. He was awarded an honorary LL.D. by St. John's University in 2002 and was given the Brooklyn College President's Medal of Distinction in 2003. Pitt is currently a member of the Advisory Council of the Public Company Accounting Oversight Board, a not-for-

profit corporation created by the Sarbanes-Oxley Act of 2002 to oversee the audits of public companies and broker-dealers.

Further, he is an independent fiduciary director of the international hedge funds of Paulson & Co. Inc., and a member of their Audit Committees. He is also a member of the Regulatory and Compliance Advisory Council for Millennium Capital Management, LLC, as well as Balyasny Asset Management L.P. He is a senior advisor to Teneo Holdings LLC, a global business consulting firm. In 2017, he was appointed to the Advisory Board of JBS USA Holdings, Inc. In addition, he previously served for three years on the National Cathedral School's Board of Trustees, holding the titles of board vice-chair, co-chair of the board's Governance Committee, and chair of the Audit and Compensation Committees.

Kelly Richmond Pope is an associate professor in the School of Accountancy and MIS at DePaul University where her research focuses on organizational misconduct, ethics and fraud, and how

organizations design cultures and compliance systems to confront these challenges. She also teaches in executive education programs at the Kellogg School of Management at Northwestern University and the Quinlan School of Business at Loyola University, Chicago.

Pope's research on organizational misconduct culminated into directing and producing the award-wining documentary, "All the Queen's Horses," in 2017. Renowned *Chicago Sun-Times* film critic Richard Roeper cited, "Kudos to director Kelly Richmond Pope for applying just the right mix of 'What the heck?' whimsy and respectful, serious reporting to this incredible tale." The film explores the largest municipal fraud in U.S. history and premiered as the No. 1 documentary on iTunes, Amazon Prime Video, Google Play, and DirectTV during its debut week on the videoon-demand platforms in April 2018.

At the organizational level, Pope examines factors in the ethical decision-making process as well as what encourages employees to whistle-blow. This research has been published in leading accounting and business ethics journals and was selected to be developed as a TED Ed lesson titled "How People Rationalize Fraud" and a TEDx Talk titled "Why Do We Hate Whistle-Blowers?"

Pope is a popular keynote speaker and frequently advises firms about their compliance programs and training. She is regularly invited to speak to regulators, including the Department of Justice, Securities and Exchange Commission, PCAOB, Internal Revenue Service-Criminal Investigations, and the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

Prior to joining the faculty at DePaul University, Pope worked in the forensic accounting practice at KPMG. She received her doctorate in accounting from Virginia Tech and is a licensed CPA.

Fixing the Broken Budgeting Process in the Digital Age

Gary Cokins, CPIM, Founder, Analytics-Based Performance Management

The annual budgeting process is regularly criticized as being obsolete soon after it is published following months of preparation, and is prone to gamesmanship with "padding" by managers, cumbersome to consolidate cost center spreadsheets, not demand-volume sensitive, and disconnected from executives' strategy. The challenge is how to resolve these deficiencies, which can be done through driverbased expense projections that are useful for decision analyses such as what-if scenarios.

To complicate matters, traditional budgets are typically incremented or decremented by a small percent change from each cost center's prior year's spending level. This "use it or lose it" behavior by managers in the last few months of the fiscal year unnecessarily pumps up their prior year's spending projections and consequently confuses determining which departments really need how much budget for the coming year.

The solution to poor budgeting is capacity-sensitive, driver-based rolling financial forecasting using today's software technologies. The result is a proforma income statement, balance sheet, and cash flow statement for each month extending well beyond the fiscal year-end month.

Four components of the corporate and enterprise performance management (CPM/EPM) framework can be drawn on to resolve these limitations. They are a

strategy map, a risk management matrix, capital projects, and activity-based costing principles. The first three are project-based and the last are for recurring operational expense projections. Ideally, the correct and valid amount of future spending for headcount capacity and consumed expenses should be derived from two broad streams of workload that cause the need for spending – demand-driven and project-driven.

Demand-driven expenses are operational and recurring from day to day. Their requirements are typically from customers. In contrast, project-driven spending (e.g., strategy initiatives, risk mitigation) is nonrecurring and can be from days to years in time duration. All these demands on an organization's workload can be integrated into a rolling financial forecast using today's software technologies.

HISTORY OF THE CONFERENCE

- Four decades ago, two active members of the IMA Akron Chapter wanted to start something positive at Kent State University (or "KSU") following the shootings on campus. Its two founding members, Glen "Woody" Woodson (who died in April 2006 at age 81) and Dr. Norman R. Meonske (professor emeritus at KSU) held the first conference in March 1976, focusing on ERISA (Employee Retirement Income Security Act of September 2, 1974), a very hot subject at the time.
 - Since then, the conference organizers have tried to tackle subjects that were ground-breaking and offered broad appeal. Recently, financial reporting has provided the backbone of the conference activities. Today, the conference is recognized as "...one of the top five financial accounting and reporting conferences in the country."
 - The conference has always been held at Kent State University, except for a Replacement Cost Seminar in October 1976 (held at Tangier restaurant in Akron, Ohio) and the Sixth Annual Conference in 1980 (held in Columbus, Ohio).



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
