IMA membership and the CMA® (Certified Management Accountant) program continue to grow in Fiscal Year 2019 (Metrics through March 31, 2019)

- IMA membership reached 134,494 (up 25% year-over-year)

In 1990, the Chapter went through a reorganization, moving its meeting locations and changed its name to Amador Valley. The new name reflected the new geographical location (South Contra Costa County and South Alameda County) of chapter members and meetings.

On July 1, 2014, the Amador Valley Chapter and the Oakland - East Bay Chapter merged. The Merged Chapter retained the Oakland - East Bay Chapter Number for historical significance. The Merged Chapter is named the East Bay - Northern California Chapter as there was an historical East Bay Chapter in IMA history and our members are located in Western and Southern Contra Costa County and Alameda County.

All of us are facing demands on our daily jobs and hiring can be the last thing we want on our to do list. Once you make the hire, it feels great to remove that "task" off of your plate. We move on with our days and then the person shows up and we start the onboarding process. Some companies will do a small amount of pre-start communication but many do not. Employee retention begins even before the individual starts their first day. Here are three suggestions to make a difference for a new employee before they even show up in your lobby.

Mail

Send a company brochure or press release with a simple note saying that you are looking forward to having them on your team. Huge impact!

<u>Emai</u>

Send an email update to let them know that their work tools have been ordered (computer, cell phone, business cards, etc.). It lets them know that they are important.

In Person

Meet for a coffee/tea or lunch or invite them to a company event. This allows them to already feel engaged with you, the team and the company.

Everyone wants to feel like they matter. Let your new hires <u>and</u> current employees know how vital they are to the success of the company!

CMA (Certified Management Accountant) Certification Exam to Be Updated With an Increased Focus on Technology in January 2020

ICMA® (The Institute of Certified Management Accountants), the certification division of IMA® (The Institute of Management Accountants), announced that it is making changes to its CMA® (Certified Management Accountant) exam. The updates to the exam are being made to ensure the CMA remains relevant in the ever-evolving environment of the management accounting profession. The changes will be effective January 1, 2020.

The new CMA exam will be changed in both parts but remain a two-part exam. Each part will be a four-hour test with 100 multiple-choice questions and two essays. IMCA is saying that what will change is some of the content:

- Part 1 of the exam will contain a new section called Technology and Analytics. This section, which will comprise 15% of Part 1, will test new topics like information systems, data governance, technology-enabled finance transformation, and data analytics. To accommodate this new material, content from other sections will be reduced. Part 1 of the exam will also have a new title: "Financial Planning, Performance, and Analytics."
- Part 2 of the exam will also be revised and include greater emphasis on ethics and strategic decision making. It will have a new title as well: "Strategic Financial Management."

The Strategic Finance Magazine has an article "KEEPING THE CMA RELEVANT" which provides background on why the CMA Exam is changing.

Juras is the Vander Wolk Professor of Managerial Accounting and Operational Performance at Babson College, where he teaches managerial accounting and strategic cost management courses in the

M.B.A. and undergraduate programs. Before joining the Babson faculty, Juras taught at Wake Forest University. He earned his Ph.D. from Syracuse University and both his B.B.A. and M.B.A. from Pace University.

Juras' area of expertise is strategic management accounting. He has published articles in numerous periodicals, including the *Journal of Corporate Accounting and Finance, Issues in Accounting Education, The CPA Journal, and Strategic Finance,* and his current research interests focus on contemporary cost management systems. Juras also has co-authored a cost management textbook as well as numerous case studies with a cost management perspective. In addition, he has consulted with various corporations and public accounting firms.

Juras has provided service to IMA in various roles, including as a member of the Global Board of Directors, chair of the ICMA Board of Regents, chair of the IMA Research Foundation, and chair of the Performance Oversight and Audit Board Committee. He also spent 10 years as associate editor of the IECJ® (IMA Educational Case Journal). In 2015, he received IMA's R. Lee Brummet Award for Distinguished Accounting Educators.
