I am very excited that our chapter continues to grow. Since 12/31/17, the number of our Professional Members has grown by **30%** and we have an incredible **159%** more Student Members.

Meeting attendance has increased even more dramatically – 2020 vs 2019: **+61%** (despite COVID and at a time that many other chapters have become less active) and 2020 vs 2018: **+254%**.

Treasurer's Report

The chapter is off to a great start for 2021 with chapter cash balance of \$12,285 excluding receipts for IMA TX Annual Conference in 2021. We awarded two \$500 scholarships to our student board members (see page 8), Addison LePere and Amanda Craig, for their outstanding contribution to the chapter (see page 8). We also purchased a 1 year, 1 seat subscription for zip code mapping software, E-Spatial, for \$1,165 to better serve our members based on their geographic location. Texas Council, Dallas, and Houston chapters have agreed to partially reimburse the cost of software (\$150 each). We continue to receive sponsorship for our monthly meetings.
