ABOUT THE SPEAKER:

Speaker: Laura Brewer

Presentation Title: What Are Tariffs and How Do They Affect Me?"

Presentation Summary: The presentation will explain how President Trump's tariff increases in China are affecting Lowe's International Supply Chain. I will also explain why President Trump wants to increase the tariffs and what is happening in China and other countries as a result. The economic result of these tariffs for Lowe's and the consumer and how it will impact us will be discussed.

Laura Brewer is an International Transportation Specialist at Lowe's Hardware. She is responsible for the management of Lowe's 3rd Party Logistics Partners, specifically in the North China region. Mrs. Brewer compiles and analyzes data to evaluate KPI points. Mrs. Brewer also collaborates with diverse groups of partners overseas to direct and provide leadership towards identifying and resolving the root cause of complex supply chain issues affecting Lowe's international business units. Issues include data integrity problems, tariff topics, purchase order issues, and other common anomalies. Mrs. Brewer started with Lowe's Hardware in May of 2016.

Before beginning her career at Lowe's Hardware, Mrs. Brewer worked at Merchant's Distributors Inc., located in Hickory, NC. During her 20 years there, she worked in almost every department, with 13 years in domestic transportation. There she performed systems analysis, implementation of the system as recommended by her analysis, the execution, and training for over 300 truck drivers.

Mrs. Brewer is an Appalachian Alum and holds a Master's Degree in Business Administration with a concentration in Data Analytics as well as a Bachelor of Science Business Administration majoring in Computer Information Systems. She also minored in Supply Chain Management.

In Mrs. Brewer's spare time, she enjoys playing with her rescue dog, Vegas. She also plays in a rock-n-roll band with her husband and long-time friend, Wade. The band name is Home Brewed as they started playing at home and her last name is Brewer. She resides in Lenoir, NC.

American Red Cross Volunteer Opportunity

The American Red Cross is always looking for volunteers to assist in various aspects of its mission to help the community when needs arise. Hurricanes Florence and Michael have been the most recent large scale examples where all skills and abilities of volunteers have been put to work over a wide area of area of destruction. But there are daily instances in which the needs are local, on a smaller scale but no less devastating to the clients. For example, over the November 4th weekend there were 11 incidents (mostly house fires) in our immediate area that the Red Cross responded to. These involved 11 different households and impacted the lives of 31 people. Two person responder teams were in the field at all hours providing physical and emotional support and setting wheels in motion for follow up and on-going support. The "back office" team worked in background to further the efforts.

Skills and backgrounds, such as ours, in accounting or inventory control, are always in demand to support the volunteers and professional staff in the field.

Currently there is a need for a volunteer in this region for an inventory specialist. The Red Cross has lots of supplies and equipment to keep track of for immediate deployment when disaster hits. What does the organization have, where is it located, what condition is in, how can the logistics be worked to get the "stuff" to where it's needed.

Responsibilities: To maintain the client assistance inventory spreadsheet and coordinate the biannual inventory audits for the Blue Ridge Piedmont Chapter

Skills/qualities needed: Responsible & trustworthy, have a basic level of Excel fluency

Time required: Flexible schedule consisting of approx. 20-30 minutes weekly with some additional time necessary when completing the May/November inventory audits

Location: All work can be completed virtually with an internet connection and a computer

Other: American Red Cross performs background checks on all volunteers during the application process
