## MINUTES OF THE TSS MEETING, SAN ANTONIO

Minutes of the Transportation Science Section Meeting, Monday November 6, 2000

- 1. The meeting was called to order by Marius Solomon, TSS past President, at 6:10 p.m.
- 2. Solomon thanked Bernard Gendron for his work as Secretary/treasurer, especially during the transition period that followed the beginning of the term of the new President Julien Bramel.
- 3. Julien Bramel thanked Marius Solomon for his work as President during the last two years. He also thanked Peter Chen for organizing the TSS cluster of sessions at the San Antonio meeting.
- 4. Paolo Toth, the chairman of the Dissertation Award Committee, announced this year's winners. The Committee was formed by Ismail Chabini, Pitu Mirchandani, Oli Madsen and Jean-Yves Potvin. The winners are: Hillel Bar-Gera,
- 7. Gilbert Laporte, Editor of Transportation Science, reported on the refereeing process at the journal. He also announced that the journal will be formatted with a new composer using the same style as for the journal Management Science. He finally announced that two focused issues have been recently published (ITS --February 2000, Public Transit -- May 2000) and that three more are forthcoming (Supply Chain Management -deadline September 30 2000, Freight -deadline November 30 2000, Real-Time Fleet Management -deadline May 2001).
- 8. Martine Labbe updated the members on the organization of the TRISTAN meeting, to be held in the Azores from June 13 to June 19, 2001. She announced that the deadline for abstract submission is December 31, 2000.
- 9. Julien Bramel announced that Martine Labbe is nominated in the new

- 12. Julien Bramel announced that a new position of Webmaster is created. The person that will occupy this position will soon be named.
- 13. Julien Bramel announced that the chair of the next Dissertation Award Committee will be Ismail Chabini.
- 14. Hani Mahmassani Announced that the deadline for submitting a thesis for the International Association for Travel Behavior Dissertation Award is February 2001.
- 15. Hani Mahmassani announced that he is involved in the organization of the triennial ISSTT meeting,
