The 2004 INFORMS Computing Society Prize for research excellence in the interface between operations research and computer science was awarded to Nick Sahinidis and Mohit Towarmalani for their many contributions to nonlinear global optimization, the book *Convexification and Global Optimization in Continuous and Mixed-Integer Nonlinear Programming: Theory, Algorithms, Software, and Applications*, and the work embodied in the BARON software package. Coin-OR Foundation



Awards the 2004 ICS Prize

for

Research Excellence in the Interface

Between Operations Research and Computer Science

to

Nikolaos V. Sahinidis and Mohit Tawarmalani

for their contributions to the field of Nonlinear global optimization summarized in their book Convexification and Global Optimization in Continuous and Mixed-Integer Nonlinear Programming, and embodied in the BARON software package

The work embodied in this book and the BARON software package comprises a path-breaking advance in the theory and computational practice of optimizing nonconvex nonlinear models. Mathematical programming methods have traditionally only been able to compute local optima of such models, and practitioners seeking global optima had to resort to a variety of heuristic and *ad hoc* techniques. This work, drawing on original contributions of the authors and the work of many other researchers, addresses the computation of provably global optima by bringing together a variety of mathematical programming techniques ranging from branch and bound to convex analysis. It thus unites a number of traditionally separate research areas in creating an enabling technology for new application fields. The book also includes interesting engineering applications, with computational results giving persuasive proof of the work's usefulness. Given the challenging nature of the models it addresses, the success of BARON is remarkable. Work of this nature opens up new applications for the future of mathematical programming.

Report on *INFORMS Journal on Computing*David Kelton, Editor-in-Chief
Oct. 25, 2004, ICS business meeting
Denver INFORMS conference

- Publication of Volume 16 (2004)
 - All four issues on time
 - 39 papers, 504 pages, up from 22 papers and 444 pages last year
 - Due to increased submission rate and backlog, granted an increase in page budget from 448 to 512 for 2004
 - Same request has been granted for 2005
 - 4th issue: Special Issue on Computational Molecular Biology/Bioinformatics, Guest-Editor Harvey Greenberg

- Flow of papers over last 12-month period
 - Excluding special issues/clusters, 135 new submissions (up from 128 in prior 12 months), finished processing on 109 papers (up from 103), 24% accepted (down from 35%)
 - Including special issues/clusters, 170 new submissions
 - Backlog stands at 53 papers (after 4th 2004 issue), up from 36 this time last year
- Special issues, special papers
 - First paper in 3rd issue this year, state-of-the-art survey, Opportunities for Combinatorial Optimization in Computational Biology by Harvey Greenberg, William Hart, Giuseppe Lancia
 - Special Issue on Computational Molecular Biology/Bioinformatics, (Harvey Greenberg), published as 4th issue of this year
 - Special Issue on OR in Electrical and Computer Engineering (John Chinneck), several papers complete
 - Special Cluster of papers on Computation in Music (Elaine Chew), almost all papers almost complete
 - One Feature Articles (Ed Wasil), almost complete

Website

- Still very plain, but is functioning well
 - 25 Online Supplements (up from 12 last year)
- Project for online subject/keyword index for entire history of journal (about half done now ... got an internal university grant for help) ... implementation pending decision about open access for back issues
- Still no need for online submission forms, reviewing, tracking

Areas and Personnel

- Area lineup is the same
 - Had joint Telecom/EC Area with Area Co-Editors Prakash Mirchandani and Ramayya Krishnan
 - Krishnan stepped down, so Prakash will handle EC as well
- Two Associate Editors stepped down
 - Rita Vachani, Hans Blanc
- Five new Associate Editors appointed
 - Raghu Raghavan, Nicola Secomandi, Leyuan Shi, Arne Lokketangen, Edmund Burke
- I agreed to stay an extra 7th year, through 2006

Production

- Process, page style remained essentially the same, both working well
- Emily Sullivan replaced Steve Siegforth at INFORMS as JOC Production Editor

Finances

- Close of 2003: revenue = \$110K (down from \$120K last year), expenses = \$73K (same as last year)
 - The \$73K expenses include \$8K overhead to INFORMS
 - Institutional Sponsorship at \$3000, down from \$2500
- 2004 through June: revenue = \$68K, expenses = \$43K

Circulation

- Total = 1,564 (down from 1,755 last year)
 - 96% of the drop is in IPOL suite subscriptions for all INFORMS journals (731, down from 952 last year)
 - 770 JOC-only (union of print, online) (down from 803)
 - The 770 includes 268 libraries, down from 273 last year
 - One bright spot INFORMS-members' "dues" journal, now 224 (up from 191 last year, and at an all-time high)
- Citations (grain of salt, please)
 - ISI Impact Factor = 0.761 for 2003 (down from 0.979 in 2002)
 - Was 0.729 in 2001, estimated 0.308 in 2000, not indexed earlier
 - 11th of 57 "OR & MS" journals that ISI indexed in 2003
 - 7th of 54 in 2002, 8th of 53 in 2001, 24th of 50 in 2000
 - 3rd among 11 INFORMS journals (MS = 2, MOR = 7)

Plans

- Monitor submission, throughput rates, page budget
 - INFORMS VP/Pubs Fred Murphy: maybe JOC could become semi-monthly rather than quarterly ...

- LaTeX, BiBTeX support coming from INFORMS
- Work off some of backlog with higher page budget
