

Decision Making for Emerging Risks

Call for Student Poster Presentations

Conference Overview: The COVID-19 pandemic highlighted the need for tools and methods for risks that are not yet fully understood. In this and many other situations, decisions need to be made when uncertainty is high and science is changing. In light of emerging risk information, how can decision makers implement good decision practices, be poised to incorporate new information on the risks, and tend to public perceptions and biases that could hinder risk management in the future?

Call for Student Poster Presentations: The conference organizers invite poster presentations led by current students relevant to the topics of decision making for emerging risks. Pre-recorded video presentations describing applications of decision analysis and risk analysis to any relevant domain are welcome. Application areas include, but are not limited to: public health, engineering and infrastructure, cybersecurity, emerging technology, and others. The poster session will be asynchronous, with short pre-recorded videos sent out to meeting participants prior to the meeting. ***Registered participants will be able to vote on their favorite student videos!***

To participate in the Student Poster Presentation session, you must be a currently-enrolled student or have graduated in the Spring 2021 semester. Please submit your abstracts via the abstract submission form posted to the conference website.

- Abstract submission deadline: 15 May
- Acceptance decisions with information on how to create and upload your videos: 31 May
- Video submission deadline: 15 June
- Links to the videos will be sent to participants during the week of the conference.
